- The ability to obtain and maintain a Restricted Area Identification Card
- The ability to successfully complete a Criminal Record Check, as well as additional background checks required by EIC AMOs
- Willingness to commit a minimum of five years of combined service as an Apprentice and as a licensed AME with one or more EIC AMOs

Work with your AMO to agree upon and enroll yourself in an Aircraft Maintenance Engineer Diploma program at one of Canada's many training institutions. From coast to coast, find the school that suits you best.



Complete your first year of education.



During the summer months, you'll work as an aircraft maintenance Apprentice at your AMO putting your new skills to the test. Get to know your company, your team, and get some hands-on experience on the aircraft that you'll build your career maintaining. Earn a financial award for a summer well spent.



Complete your second year of education. Your classroom training is now complete!
